10/4/21 finished the book. Ending was a bit harsh. Didn't really care for the book. The writing style IMO was just not there for me. I give this book a 6/10



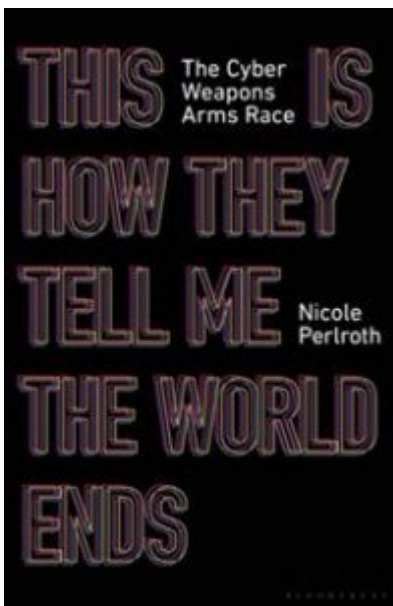
Nicole Perlroth – This Is How

I started this book on 8/24/2021.

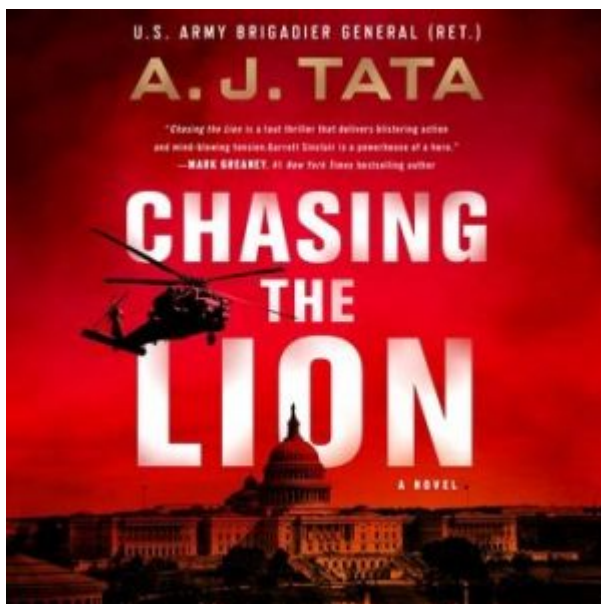

That ending though...She got her daughter back, got the bad guys and lived. Great book I would highly recommend.



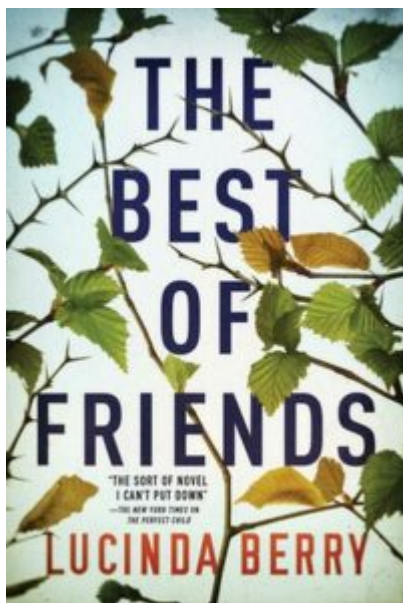
The Best of Friends

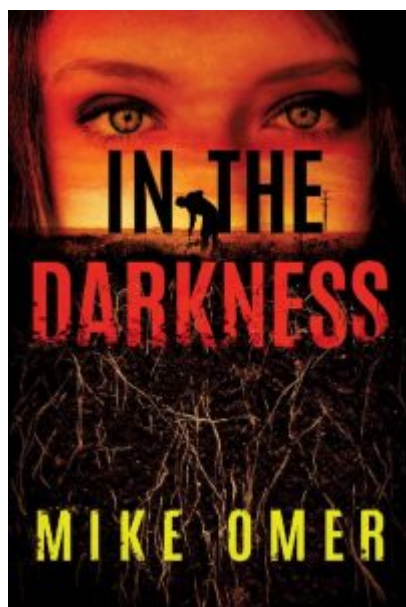

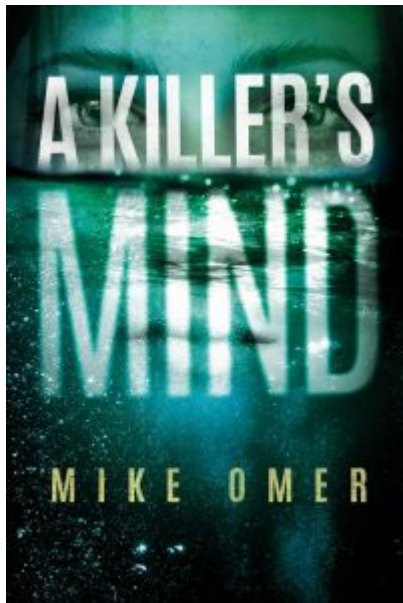
Her partner really came through for her and dug up (pun intended) some very helpful intel to get her safe.

So....I actually have already read this book. It was really good. I'm going to NOT count this as a book read this year. I will start book 2 in the series today. 6/18/2021.

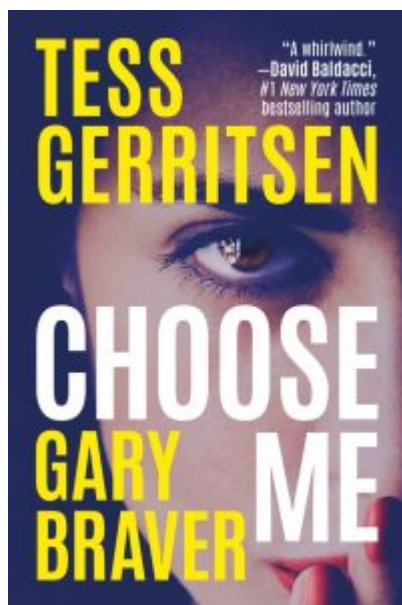


Choose Me by Gary Braver

6/15/2021 I just finished the book. Never saw the ending coming. This was a really good ending.



The Next Wife by Kaira Rouda

Started on May 28th, 2021. An Amazon first read. Never read the author before. Looks like short “person” chapters.
